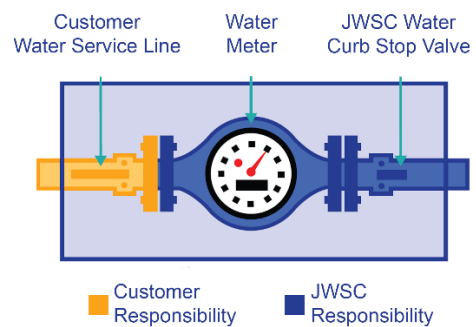
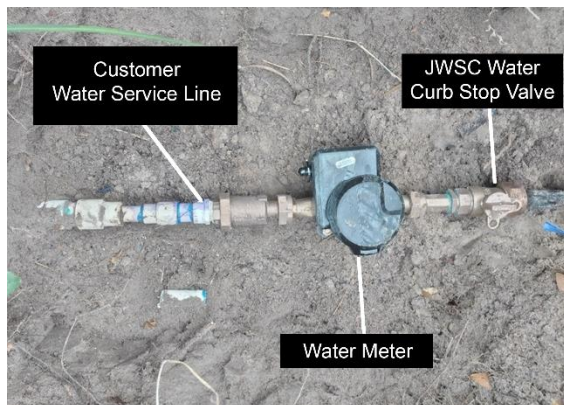

HOW TO IDENTIFY YOUR WATER SERVICE MATERIAL:



LSL IDENTIFICATION GUIDE

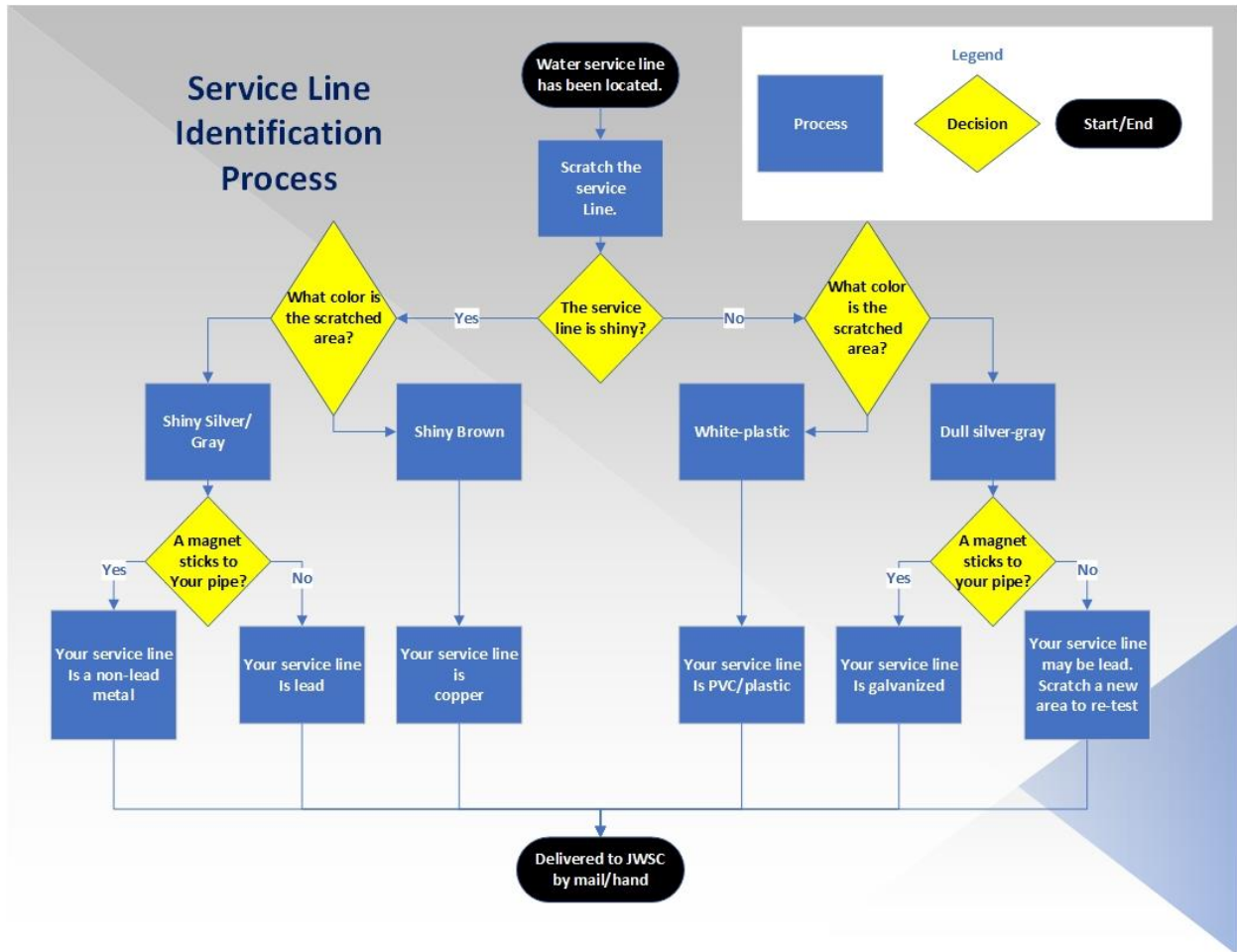
1. Find your water meter. For most homes, the water meter is located near the right-of-way easement of the property. Sometimes, it is in line with a power pole, telecommunications box, or electrical box. It will look similar to what is pictured above:

2. Locate the water service line as it enters into the building from the water meter. Do you see the “Curb stop” identified in the picture above? Do you see the arrows on the water meter? This shows how the water supply moves from the outside pipes into your plumbing through the meter into the internal plumbing.

3. Identify a “test area” on the pipe between the point where it leaves the meter box and meets your home. Expose a small area of the pipe if it is covered or wrapped.

4. Have a screwdriver and magnet handy. Use the flat edge of a screwdriver to scratch the pipe gently. Remove any corrosion that may have built up on the outside of the pipe.
